Granbury Independent School District

Superintendent of Schools (2012-2018)

- Our career and technical education (CTE) students were national champions in the **F1 in Schools program**, which allowed them to compete internationally, representing the USA. (2015-2018)
- We started the **Eagles Nest program** that allowed our aeronautical engineering students to work with local mentors to build two fully-functional RV-12 aircraft. (2016-18)
- Granbury High School was named one of the top 175 high schools in Texas and among the **top 10% of high schools in the nation** two years in a row by the U.S. News and World Report. (2014, 2015)
- In November of 2013, GISD passed an **\$84.9 million bond package**, the largest in school history and the 6th largest in Texas on this election day. The bond addressed safe and secure entries at all campuses, \$11 million in technology upgrades, and a complete renovation of Granbury High School, complete with a new Career/Tech Center and fine arts improvements. This bond passed with almost 60% of the vote. The last bond that went before voters in GISD several years earlier failed badly.
- In 2013, GISD began a 3-year process to train all teachers in **Project Based Learning (PBL)** through the Burke Institute. This type model encourages students to take ownership in their learning and centers on real-life scenarios and presentations to community audiences.
- Entered into an **energy savings and conservation** agreement that replaced all lighting, 20-year old HVAC units, water conservation measures, and a new synthetic turf field in GISD. These measures resulted in a significant utility savings for our district. (2013)
- Worked with the City of Granbury to purchase, through donations, a **dog that is trained to detect drugs and weapons**. This dog is on GISD property every day of the school year and works with an officer whose salary is paid by GISD. (2013)

- Began a **Customer Care** process with administrators to build relationships across the District and create an attitude of “treat others the way I would want to be treated, if I were in their shoes.” (2012)
- Implemented **G-2020**, a strategic design process involving hundreds of students, staff and community members to map out the future of GISD. (2012)
- Created the **Superintendent’s Student Advisory Council (SSAC)**, a group of High School students who meet with me 4-5 times a year to discuss issues in our schools and their ideas about how we can provide them the best education possible. (2012)
- Created a **Speaker’s Bureau**, a data base of local experts, who volunteer to come to our schools, speak to our students and create a link between our classroom and the “real world.” (2012)
- Began a semi-regular column, **GISD Talking Points**, with our local newspaper and also have periodic appearances on local radio and TV channels to discuss education and our schools. (2012)

Rusk Independent School District Superintendent of Schools (2001-2012)

- RISD received **\$1.3 million in technology grants** (Vision 20-20 and Connections) that provided laptop computers to all students in grades 4-8, and expanded technology at the High School.
- Completed **renovations on several campuses in 2010** that included a new entry at the High School, Science labs at the Junior High, and expanded cafeteria space at Rusk Primary.
- Rusk ISD became a **Recognized District** in 2010 and again in 2011.
- Completed the **renovation of Eagle Stadium** that includes adding a lane to our **track**, a **complete track re-surface**, and adding a **synthetic turf** playing field. Also, other cosmetic enhancements, fencing, concrete, etc. (completed in 2011)
- Headed a **construction team** to design, develop, and build a new “**Eagle Coliseum**” competition gym. This facility seats over 1300 and is a state-of-the-art facility (completed in 2009).
- Implemented **longevity pay program** for teachers to encourage stability in our staff. This program began in 2007.
- Lead all staff in a year-long email-based **book study**. (began in 2005)
- Installed a DVD based CCTV **security camera system** on all campuses in the District. These cameras monitor inside public areas as well as targeted outside locations. (2005)
- Added **AED’s** (Automated External Defibrillators) on all campuses and athletic facilities in the District. (2005) This was before it was mandated.
- Introduced a “**Grab and Go Breakfast**” program at all campuses that gives all children a free breakfast each morning. (began in 2004)

- Rusk Primary and Elementary schools became “**Exemplary**” campuses. This was the first time these two campuses had achieved this rating. (2004, 2005, 2008, 2009, 2010) “Recognized” 2006, 2007, 2011)
- Rusk Intermediate School became a “**Recognized**” campus in 2007 (2008, 2009, 2011) and an Exemplary campus in 2010.
- In 2006, Rusk Junior High became a “**Recognized**” campus for the first time in its history. (2008, 2009, 2010, 2011)
- In 2002 (2003), Rusk High School became an “**Exemplary**” campus. This was the first time in the school’s history that it had achieved a rating higher than academically acceptable. RHS was rated “**Recognized**” in 2010.
- Several of our campuses have received **Title I Distinguished School** recognition in recent years and all campuses have received numerous **Gold Performance Acknowledgements**.
- Headed a project to connect all five of our campuses with “**air blown**” **fiber optic** cabling for networking between all campuses. (2005)
- Implemented **incentive programs** for attendance and performance that impacted all employees of the District by paying incentives once a year (if earned) as part of a November pay supplement. (2005)
- Headed construction team to build a new facility that includes an **auditorium** as well as “state of the art” **science labs and additional classrooms** at the JH and HS campuses. (completed in 2005)
- Coordinated with County Health Department to offer **flu vaccinations** to all RISD students and have them administered at school with parent permission. (2004)
- Negotiated 15-year contract with Lamar Advertising to use **highway billboards** to promote Rusk ISD (2003).
- Rusk ISD successfully completed a District Effectiveness and Compliance (**DEC**) **visit** with only 2 citations in Special Education. We had no citations in all other programs. (2003)
- Negotiated contract with East Texas Medical Center to provide our staff and their family members free access to the Olympic Center for **wellness and weight training** (2002).
- Headed a **construction team** to design, develop, and build a new **Intermediate School** to house 4th and 5th graders (completed in 2003).
- Created Director of Instructional Programs position to concentrate on “**focused instruction**” throughout the district. This person works with all principals and staff to align curriculum both vertically and throughout departments (2001).
- Implemented an **energy conservation program** by retrofitting all lighting throughout the district and installed motion sensors in each room to turn off lights when no person is in the room. We also installed motion sensors on our toilets and throughout the new Intermediate school. We have seen significant savings each year in electrical costs due to these improvements.
- Received **Instructional Facilities Allotment** grant in the amount of \$5 million for the construction of a new intermediate campus facility (2003).

- Rusk Junior High was named a **National Demonstration School** for the AVID program which is a program for at-risk children that encourages them to prepare for college. We have been awarded this distinction each year from 2001-2012.

Chireno Independent School District

Superintendent of Schools (1998-2001)

- In three years, we **doubled the fund balance** of our district, while at the same time showed marked improvement in facilities, transportation, and the academic program.
- Successfully passed a **bond election** with an **82% favorable vote** in May of 2000. This election was for the construction of a new High School and cafetorium.
- Negotiated an exclusive contract with **Coca-Cola** that provided our students with guaranteed yearly scholarships as well as other financial incentives.
- In 2001, our **District** was rated **Recognized** by TEA for the first time in its history.
- In 2000, our **High School** received a **Texas Successful Schools Award** from TEA.
- In 1999, 2000 and 2001, our **High School** campus received a rating of **Exemplary** from the TEA. 1999 was the first year our school had ever received this rating.
- In 2001, our **Elementary** school was rated **Recognized** by TEA.
- Began a comprehensive pre-testing and staff development program for **TAAS Improvement** and Curriculum Alignment.
- Our District was named a **TEKStar showcase school** for our use of a computerized curriculum program.
- Our district was named a **Title I Honor School** in 2001, and a **Title I Commended School** in 1999 and 2000. These awards were for achieving academic excellence in a District with over 60% economically disadvantaged students.
- Began an **energy conservation** program by replacing all existing lighting with more energy efficient fixtures. We paid for the system with reduced electric bills.
- Supervised to completion a new **wetlands wastewater treatment facility** for our school.

Queen City Independent School District

High School Principal (1994-1998)

- Our campus was rated **Recognized** by the Accountability System for Texas Public Schools. We earned this rating for four consecutive years, with 1996 being the first time the campus had ever achieved that rating.
- After implementing numerous TAAS improvement strategies, our campus made tremendous gains in all areas of the TAAS test. In three years, we had a combined gain of **38% in Math, 19% in Reading and 13% in Writing**.
- Our high school was one of the **pilot schools** in Texas for the inclusion of special education students.
- We made a scheduling change to the **Accelerated Block** schedule for the high school. Teams of teachers, students, and administrators were involved in the process and enjoyed the positive effects of the schedule.

- We had a very effective **site-based team** in place on our campus that was involved in many areas of school improvement, including hiring new employees, providing input to the administration and other areas of importance to the staff and school.

Coldspring-Oakhurst CISD

Assistant High School Principal (1991-1994)

- Served as a leader in a pilot program to **integrate curriculum** in the high school.
- Developed an **alternative school program** to serve students who would normally have been expelled from school. (This was before the State mandated this practice.)
- Developed a new **discipline management** plan for our campus and updated the student and teacher handbooks.
- **Everyday responsibilities** included 1) primary administrator in charge of discipline; 2) teacher evaluations and walk-through observations; 3) coordinating extra duties for teachers and staff; 4) general personnel administration.

Head Baseball Coach-I took over a baseball program that had never had a winning season and never been in the playoffs.

- In my first season, we posted the best record in school history, and in my second and third seasons we represented our school in the playoffs.
- We were District and Bi-District champions in 1994 and lost to eventual state finalist Waco Robinson in the Regional Playoffs.

Assistant Football Coach/Athletic Trainer-Duties included coaching as needed on the football field and the everyday operation of an athletic training room.
